Dance Forms of the African Diaspora; Hip-Hop, TD 2 Semesters

In this studio-based course, students will learn movement techniques rooted in Afro-diasporic aesthetic and physical qualities including groundedness, curvilinearity, polyrhythm, syncopation, and polycentrism. Class is movement-centered, but also emphasizes understanding the historical and cultural contexts, introduces a cross-section of many movement styles under the umbrella term Hip-hop; fundamental pillars of Hip-hop; and both "mainstream" and countercultural level aspects of Hip-hop dance and culture.

Acting I: TD171 1 Semester

This studio-based course explores the use of the body, voice, emotion, and intellect to create a theatrical character. Through close study of Stanislavski's system, students prepare

monologues and scenes to articulate possible interpretations of a play script or performance clearly and effectively. In-class performances further an awareness of individual and ensemble physicality in order to communicate emotion, thought, aesthetic intention, and mind-body awareness. Emphasis on analysis and concentration.

1 Semester

A lecture-style interactive introduction to the theatrical arts, fulfilling the Literary and Artistic general education requirement

Introduction to Acting: THTR 120

4 Semesters

Introductory acting course for non-majors designed to help broaden communication, presentation, and social skills. The class focuses on the craft of acting through a broad array of styles and techniques. Students develop a more articulate, responsive, and expressive identity. Students gain an extended understanding of self and of other people and a stronger sense of public presentation skills leading to better social and professional interactions.

Introduction to Hip-Hop: DANC 108A

3 Semesters

An introductory survey course designed to expose students to urban movement and art forms. The class encourages students to develop musicality, improvisational and performance skills, as well as define their own understanding of the historical and social contexts of some street and urban dance styles.

Intermediate Hip-Hop: DANC 291

1 Semester

An advanced dance course designed to build on student's current knowledge of the movement styles and advance their technical skill through hip-hop choreography. It develops the student's musicality, improvisational skills, and performative abilities and encourages students to begin choreographing through the hip-hop dance medium as well as define their own understanding of the historical and social contexts of some street and urban dance styles.
